

PARISHONERS IN HOSPITAL



Parishioners in Moncton City Hospital are reminded that if they want to receive a visit from the parish priest or pastoral care worker, it is necessary to identify themselves as being members of their specific parish when they are admitted to hospital. The clergy visiting lists for priests and pastoral care visitors are printed out according to parish identification. This means that if you haven't identified yourself as belonging to our parish, the priest or pastoral care visitors will not be aware that you have been admitted to hospital and will not be able to visit. If for some reason you are not asked on admission, you or your family can ask your nurse to call the Spiritual Care Department and have your name added to the pastoral visiting and communion lists.

If a visit/communion is needed upon your return home from hospital, or move from home to another residence within the parish grouping, please inform the Parish Office so your name can be added to the pastoral visiting and communion lists for shut-ins.

Parishioners at the George Dumont Hospital are asked to contact the Parish Office if they wish to receive a visit from their parish priest or pastoral care visitor. Unfortunately, at the George Dumont Hospital, we are unable to generate a clergy visiting list according to parish identification. This means that if you or your family hasn't contacted the Parish Office to inform us of your admission to this hospital, we will not be able to visit.
